David Krantz is Professor of Psychology and Statistics at Columbia University, where he has served since 1985. Dr. Krantz received his Ph.D. in mathematical psychology at the University of Pennsylvania in 1964, and before joining Columbia served on the Faculty of the University of Michigan (1964-1979) and Bell Laboratories (1979-1985). Dr. Krantz's research spans a wide variety of domains in the study of decision making and perception, including color vision, measurement theory, the use of formal models in everyday reasoning, and behavioral economics. He has published over seventy articles on various aspects of measurement and decision making in psychology and other fields and has authored or co-authored five books, including the three volumes of *Foundations of Measurement* with Duncan Luce, Patrick Suppes, and Amos Tversky.
